CLASSIFICATION OF GOODS

- <u>CLASS 1</u> Chemicals used in industry, science and photography, agriculture, horticulture and forestry; unprocessed artificial resins, unprocessed plastics; manures; fire extinguishing compositions; tempering and soldering preparations; chemical substances for preserving foodstuffs; tanning substances; adhesives used in industry.
- <u>CLASS 2</u> Paints, varnishes, lacquers; preservatives against rust and against deterioration of wood; colorants; mordants; raw natural resins; metals in foil and powder form for painters, decorators, printers and artists.
- <u>CLASS 3</u> Bleaching preparations and other substances for laundry use; cleaning, polishing, scouring and abrasive preparations; soaps; perfumery, essential oils, cosmetics, hair lotions; dentifrices.
- <u>CLASS 4</u> Industrial oils and greases; lubricants; dust absorbing, wetting and binding compositions; fuels (including motor spirit) and illuminants; candles, wicks.
- <u>CLASS 5</u> Pharmaceutical, veterinary and sanitary preparations; dietetic substances adapted for medical use, food for babies; plasters, materials for dressings; material for stopping teeth, dental wax; disinfectants; preparations for destroying vermin; fungicides, herbicides.
- <u>CLASS 6</u> Common metals and their alloys; metal building materials; transportable building of metal; materials of metal for railway tracks; non-electric cables and wires of common metal; ironmongery, small items of metal hardware; pipes and tubes of metal; safes; goods of common metal not included in other classes; ores.
- <u>CLASS 7</u> Machines and machine tools; motors and engines (except for land vehicles); machine coupling and transmission components (except for land vehicles); agricultural implements other than hand-operated; incubators for eggs.

- CLASS 8 Hand tools and implements (hand-operated); cutlery; side arms; razors.
- <u>CLASS 9</u> Scientific, nautical, surveying, electric, photographic, cinematographic, optical, weighing, measuring, signaling, checking (supervision), life saving and teaching apparatus and instruments; apparatus for recording, transmission or reproduction of sound or images; magnetic data carriers, recording discs; automatic vending machines and mechanisms for coin-operated apparatus; cash registers, calculating machines, data processing equipment and computers; fire-extinguishing apparatus.
- <u>CLASS 10</u> Surgical, medical, dental and veterinary apparatus and instruments, artificial limbs, eyes and teeth; orthopedic articles; suture materials.
- <u>CLASS 11</u> Apparatus for lighting, heating, steam generating, cooking, refrigerating, drying, ventilating, water supply and sanitary purposes.
- <u>CLASS 12</u> Vehicles; apparatus for locomotion by land, air or water.
- <u>CLASS 13</u> Firearms; ammunition and projectiles; explosives; fireworks.
- <u>CLASS 14</u> Precious metals and their alloys and goods in precious metals or coated therewith, not included in other classes; jewelry, precious stones; horological and chronometric instruments.
- **CLASS 15** Musical instruments.
- <u>CLASS 16</u> Paper, cardboard and goods made from these materials, not included in other classes; paper matter, bookbinding material; photographs; stationery; adhesives for stationery or household purposes; artists' materials; paint brushes, typewriters and office requisites (except furniture); instructional and teaching material (except apparatus); plastic materials for packaging (not included in other classes); playing cards; printers' type; printing blocks.
- <u>CLASS 17</u> Rubber, gutta-percha, gum, asbestos, mica and goods made from these materials and not included in other classes; plastics in extruded form for use in manufacturing; packing, stopping and insulating materials; flexible pipes, not of metal.
- <u>CLASS 18</u> Leather and imitations of leather, and goods made of these materials and not included in other classes; animal skins, hides; trunks and traveling bags; umbrellas, parasols and walking sticks; whips, harness and saddlery.
- <u>CLASS 19</u> Building materials (non-metallic); non-metallic rigid pipes for building; asphalt, pitch and bitumen; non-metallic transportable buildings; monuments, not of metal.
- <u>CLASS 20</u> Furniture, mirrors, picture frames; goods (not included in other classes) of wood, cork, reed, cane, wicker, horn, bone, ivory, whalebone, shell, amber, mother-of-pearl, meerschaum and substitutes for all these materials, or of plastics.
- <u>CLASS 21</u> Household or kitchen utensils and containers (not precious metal or coated therewith); combs and sponges; brushes (except paint brushes); brush-making materials; articles for cleaning purposes; steelwool; un-worked or semi-worked glass (except glass used in building); glassware, porcelain and earthenware not included in other classes.
- <u>CLASS 22</u> Ropes, string, nets, tents, awnings, tarpaulins, sails, sacks and bags (not included in other classes); padding and stuffing materials (except of rubber or plastics); raw fibrous textile materials.
- **CLASS 23** Yarns and threads, for textile use.
- CLASS 24 Textiles and textile goods, not included in other classes; bed and table covers.
- CLASS 25 Clothing, footwear, headgear.
- CLASS 26 Lace and embroidery, ribbons and braid; buttons, hooks and eyes, pins and needles; artificial flowers.

<u>CLASS 27</u> – Carpets, rugs, mats and matting, linoleum and other materials for covering existing floors; wall hangings (non-textile).

<u>CLASS 28</u> – Games and playthings; gymnastic and sporting articles not included in other classes; decorations for Christmas trees.

<u>CLASS 29</u> – Meat, fish, poultry and game; meat extracts; preserved, dried and cooked fruits and vegetables; jellies, jams, fruit sauces; eggs, milk and milk products; edible oils and fats.

<u>CLASS 30</u> – Coffee, tea, cocoa, sugar, rice, tapioca, sago, artificial coffee; flour and preparations made from cereals, bread, pastry and confectionery, ices; honey, treacle; yeast, baking-powder; salt, mustard; vinegar, sauces (condiments); spices; ice.

<u>CLASS 31</u> – Agricultural, horticultural and forestry products and grains not included in other classes; live animals; fresh fruits and vegetables; seeds, natural plants and flowers; foodstuffs for animals; malt.

<u>CLASS 32</u> – Beers; mineral and aerated waters and other non-alcoholic drinks; fruit drinks and fruit juices; syrups and other preparations for making beverages.

<u>CLASS 33</u> – Alcoholic beverages (except beers).

CLASS 34 – Tobacco; smokers' articles; matches.
