(APPROVAL OF AN ACT AUTHORIZING STATE-OPERATED CASINO GAMING AT NEWPORT GRAND IN THE CITY OF NEWPORT)

2. **AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE (RESTRICTION ON GAMBLING)**  
(Section 1 of Article XIV of the Constitution)

Approval of the amendment to Section 22 of Article VI of the Rhode Island Constitution set forth below will provide that no change in the location of gambling permitted in a municipality would occur without the further approval of the majority of those electors voting on said proposed location change in a referendum within said municipality:

**Full text of amendment for Question 2**

Section 22 of Article VI of the Constitution shall be amended to read as follows:

**Section 22. Restriction on gambling.**

No act expanding the types or locations of gambling which are permitted within the state or within any city or town therein or expanding municipalities in which a particular form of gambling is authorized shall take effect until it has been approved by the majority of those electors voting in a statewide referendum and by the majority of those electors voting in said referendum in the municipality in which the proposed gambling would be allowed and, having been so approved in said referendum in any city or town on or after November 4, 2014, the location where the gambling is permitted in any city or town shall not be changed within said city or town without the approval of the majority of those electors voting on said proposed change in a referendum in said city or town.

The secretary of state shall certify the results of the statewide referendum and the local board of canvassers of the city or town where the gambling is to be allowed shall certify the results of the local referendum to the secretary of state.

<b>QUESTIONS 8 - 11                      AMENDMENTS TO                      EXETER                      HOME RULE CHARTER</b> (As approved by the Exeter Town Council)	
<p><b>8.</b>                      Shall Article II, Elections, Section 203(a)(3), of the Charter be modified to read: "Recall. The electors of the Town shall have the power to propose the recall of any elected Town office holder for violations of the following sections of this Charter: Section 407, Forfeiture of Office, Section 903, Ethics, Section 908, Suspension and Disqualification from Office, and Section 910. Forfeiture of Office for Violation of Charter, and to cause a referendum to be held on the question of whether or not the named office holder shall be recalled and removed from office."?</p> <p>A corresponding change will be made to Article II, Section 203(c)(1), specifying that a petitioner must document a violation of Sections 407, 903, 908, or 910 of the Charter in the recall petition.</p>

<p><b>9.</b>                      Shall Article II, Elections, Section 203(c)(1), of the Charter be modified to read: "Initiative, referendum and recall petitions to the Council must be signed by twenty percent (20%) of the total number of electors registered at the most recent Town general election. Initiative, referendum and recall petitions must also include the names and addresses of the five (5) petitioners and must state the petitioners' reasons for having brought the petition. The Board of Canvassers shall promptly determine the sufficiency of valid signatures on any such petition, and shall certify such petition to the Town Clerk when such a determination has been made."?</p> <p>A corresponding change referencing the increased requirement of obtaining the signatures of twenty percent (20%) of the electors qualified at the most-recent Town general election will be made to Article II, Section 203(e)(2).</p>
