**Chief Deputy Michael DiMascolo and DSFM Michael Proto appeared for the State Fire Marshal's office. J. Kevin Culley and Vernon Wyman appeared for the University. Commissioners Blackburn and Burlingame abstained from voting on this matter. A subcommittee of the Board met with the pertinent parties on Monday, December 19, 2005, to formulate a plan of action for this facility. At the formal hearing on Tuesday, December 20, 2005, Commissioner Newbrook made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Pearson, to accept the plan of action as presented to the subcommittee on the previous day. This plan of action included, but was not limited to, provisions for fire alarm and sprinkler coverage, heat detection, exit locking devices, means of escape windows, interior wall finish, stairway enclosures and CO detection. Neither the Kingston Fire Marshal's office nor the State Fire Marshal's office had any objection to the plan of action.**
