a. Academic and Student Affairs

Solomon A. Solomon reported that the Academic and Student Affairs Committee met on Friday, May 6, 2005, at Rhode Island College. Ron Schertz and Bob Cipolla from CCRI completed a series of discussions of academic advisement on our public campuses.

Belinda Wilkerson, of the Rhode Island School Counseling Project at Providence College, gave a presentation. Ms. Wilkerson provided an overview of the American School Counselor Association's national model for K-12 advisement of students. Assistant Principal

Patti DiCenso and her staff then followed up with a detailed description of their model counseling program at North Kingstown High School. Their new approach allows student counselors to study aggregate data by grade level to identify significant group needs; counselors also work with faculty by grade level to ensure that in 15-minute daily advisories all students receive the benefit of advice from a concerned adult.

The Committee thoughtfully discussed and unanimously recommended the proposals contained in this evening's consent agenda.
