All Board Members reviewed the Open Minutes of the August 18, 2009 Board Meeting. A Motion was made by John Capobianco and seconded by Elizabeth Dolan to accept the Open Minutes as written, and it was unanimously

CONSENT AGREEMENT & AFFIDAVIT CASES:

1. Case No. EE- 3551
Newport Housing Authority & Teamsters, Local 251 (Section 8 Assistant)

After review of the Consent Agreement and Affidavit executed and presented by the parties, a Motion was made by Frank Montanaro and seconded by John Capobianco, to acknowledge and accept the parties' signed agreement; that the position(s) of Section **8 Assistant**, shall be and is hereby **accreted** to the bargaining unit as defined by Certification No. EE-3551. After review of the issues in the above-entitled matter, a Motion was then made by Ellen Jordan and seconded by Elizabeth Dolan to dismiss the Complaint. 4. Case No. ULP- 5872
State of Rhode Island – Department of Health & NEARI

After review of the drafted Decision and Order of Dismissal, a Motion was made by Ellen Jordan and seconded by Elizabeth Dolan to sign the Decision and Order, as written. After discussion, all Board Members voted in favor of the Motion and did sign the Decision and Order, as written. Motion passed.

ORDER: The Unfair Labor Practice Charge and Complaint in this matter are hereby dismissed.

5. Case No. ULP-5894
Burrillville School Committee & Burrillville Teachers' Association/NEARI

Walter Lanni, John Capobianco, Elizabeth Dolan, Gerald Goldstein, and Ellen Jordan heard the above-entitled matter formally; along with reviewing the transcript(s) and briefs, as well as the evidence submitted therein. Frank Montanaro reviewed the transcript and briefs, as well as the evidence submitted therein.



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After review of the drafted Decision, a Motion was made by Ellen Jordan and seconded by Gerald Goldstein to sign the Decision and Order, as written. After discussion, all Board Members voted in favor of the Motion and did sign the Decision and Order, as written. Motion passed.

ORDER: 1) The Employer is hereby ordered to issue a written apology to Ms. Inzer. 2) The Employer hereby ordered to cease and desist from threatening employees with “insubordination” for exercising their rights to engage in protected activity. 3) The Employer is also required to post a copy of this decision and order on employee bulletin boards for a period of thirty days from the date of its receipt.

6. Case No. ULP- 5896
City of Warwick & RI Laborers District Council, Local 1033

Walter Lanni, John Capobianco, Elizabeth Dolan, Frank Montanaro, Gerald Goldstein, Joseph Mulvey, and Ellen Jordan heard the above-entitled matter formally; along with reviewing the transcript(s) and briefs, as well as the evidence submitted therein.

After review of the drafted Decision, a Motion was made by Frank Montanaro and seconded by John Capobianco to sign the Decision and Order, as written. After discussion, all Board Members voted in favor of the Motion and did sign the Decision and Order, as written. Motion passed.

ORDER: 1) The Employer is hereby ordered to reinstate and maintain the status quo relative to terms and conditions of employment for Crossing Guards that existed at the expiration of the most recent Collective Bargaining Agreement. This Order constitutes a final Order of the Board for appellate purposes. 2) The Employer is also ordered to immediately participate fully and completely in all statutory dispute resolution mechanisms provided for in the Municipal Employees Arbitration Act, up to and including interest arbitration, as has been demanded by the Union. The Employer shall maintain the status quo of the Crossing Guard employees during the pendency of all statutory dispute mechanism procedures. This Order constitutes a final Order of the Board for appellate purposes. 3) The Employer is also ordered to make whole, any and all employees who have lost benefits and/or wages as a result of the City’s unilateral action. The Employer is hereby ordered to submit to this Board within thirty (30) days from the issuance of this Decision, a list of all affected employees and the amounts of wages/benefits that would have been due, at the rate set forth under the last year of the expired contract, had the Employer not unilaterally implemented terms and conditions of employment. The Employer shall simultaneously provide a copy of said filing to the Union. This Order constitutes a final Order of the Board for appellate purposes. 4) To the extent that there is any dispute as to the



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identity of the affected employees or the amount of wages or benefits due to the employees, pursuant to the immediately preceding Order, this Board retains jurisdiction of that issue. As such, this particular order (#4) is not a final Order of the Board at this time, for appellate purposes, but is interlocutory.

7. Case No. ULP- 5901
Newport School Department & RI Council 94, AFSCME, AFL-CIO

A Motion was made Elizabeth Dolan and seconded by Frank Montanaro to table this matter until the next monthly Board Meeting. After discussion, all Board Members voted in favor of the Motion. Motion passed.

8. Case No. EE- 3690
Town of West Greenwich & RI Laborers District Council, Local 1322

A Motion was made Elizabeth Dolan and seconded by Frank Montanaro to table this matter until the next monthly Board Meeting. After discussion, all Board Members voted in favor of the Motion. Motion passed.

MISCELLANEOUS MATTERS:

1. Case No. EE-3365
State of Rhode Island – Judiciary (Supreme Court) and RI Laborers District Council, Local 808
(Certification of Representatives Amendment)

After review of the correspondence submitted in this matter, a Motion was made by Ellen Jordan, and seconded by Elizabeth Dolan to accept the request for an amendment to the Certification of Representatives, in the above-entitled matter, to reflect a change in “position” name from Senior Management Analyst to Administrative Assistant. After discussion, all Board Members voted in favor of the Motion. Motion passed.

2. Case No. ULP- 5946
East Providence School Committee & East Providence Educational Association

After review of the above-entitled Superior Court matter, a Motion was made by Frank Montanaro and seconded by Ellen Jordan to place this case into abeyance status, pending the resolution of the declaratory Judgment in the matter currently pending before the Superior Court. All Board Members



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voted in favor of the Motion. Motion passed.

John Capobianco made a Motion for the Board to go into Closed Session for the purpose of reviewing the Unfair Labor Practice Charges, Miscellaneous Matters, and the Minutes to be closed, pursuant to 42-46-5(a)(2)(4) of the Open Meetings Law. Elizabeth Dolan seconded the Motion and it was unanimously

VOTED: for the meeting to go into closed session and to close the minutes.
