He does not appear to be a good risk for parole at this time. The Board cannot say that he could not remain at liberty without violating the law. He will flatten his sentence. The Board acknowledges Mr. Vazquez's xxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxx xxxxxxxxxxxxxx efforts as well as his improved relationship xxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxx, his interest and recognition that he xxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxx. Based on the totality of his criminal record, however, including his prior opportunity on parole in the past and his return for First Degree Robbery, the Board believes that to parole him on this record would depreciate the seriousness of his offenses and would

The Board votes to deny Mr. Windfield's parole without reconsideration in light of the seriousness of his offense, including the nature of the assault and possession of a firearm. In addition he presented with limited insight before the Board and has xxxxxxxxxxxxxxxx. On this record the Board believes to parole him would depreciate the seriousness of his offense, promote disrespect for the law and does not believe he is a good risk at this time. The Board acknowledges Mr. Young's remorse and his efforts xxxxxxxxxxxxxx, but must balance this with his involvement in the purposeful beating and murder of an innocent person, conspiracy to commit the murder, his going to great lengths to conceal it and significant xxxxxxxxxxxxxxxx on the xxxxx. The Board believes that to parole him at this time would depreciate the severity of his criminal conduct and promote disrespect for the law. Accordingly, we will deny

him but we will reconsider him in five years. (6/2020)
