returned the same afternoon with his attorney for additional proceedings in which he denied committing all aspects of the crimes for which he was convicted. He also indicated to the Board that prior statements he made to the Board today and to other professionals throughout the years (admitting guilt) were false. While it is not the Board's role to determine guilt or innocence, it is difficult for the Board to gage Mr. Taylor's likelihood of reoffending or ability to take his place safely in the community under the circumstances, especially in light of the nature and seriousness of the offense and including xxxxxxxxxxxxxxxx and xx to date.
