**The Board considered information reflecting both static and dynamic indicators including, but not limited to, criminal history, police reports(s), institutional record, risk assessment(s) and parole plan/request. The Board gave greater weight to the circumstances of this case including the brutal nature of the murder, loss of innocent life, presence of a child and its impact as well as Mr. Miguel's lack of insight and full acceptance of responsibility. The**

**Board notes that Mr. Miguel used his parole hearing to discuss limited responsibility due to an intoxicated state. Given that he pleaded to the Murder and the issue of intoxication was addressed in post-conviction filings, the Board believes this reflects limited insight on his part and a distancing of full responsibility for his actions. In light of all of these considerations the Board votes to deny parole on the basis that none of the statutory parole criteria have been met (seriousness of offense, would promote disrespect for the law, risk to re-offend without insight, could not take his place in the community). We will reconsider him in six years. We recommend he meaningfully use that time to work on these deficiencies.
