to report to parole supervision which he failed to do. A warrant has been outstanding for his arrest since November 2006. He was arrested on the warrant in 2018. He admits that he failed to report, but he indicates to the Board

that he was advised by federal authorities that he did not have an obligation to report because he was under federal custody and supervision. However, he also admits that he failed to report to a scheduled federal immigration hearing because he was afraid he would be deported. The Board finds that he violated the terms and conditions of parole by failing to report as directed in his permit and votes to revoke parole as well as to revoke eight years of street time. This revocation will effectively conclude his sentence in 2015. The Board notes for the record that an I-205 Detainer is lodged on his record.
