The Board finds he violated his parole. Notwithstanding his admission on the record, as well as his positive achievements while on parole, considering all of the circumstances including the short time Mr. Harris was in the community, his inability to comport his conduct while on parole, his history of parole violations and his absconding the Board finds that justice requires us to go outside of our guidelines to revoke all of his street time.
