**Mr. Hedstrom is before the Board for review consistent with his December 2017 Parole Minutes. The Board has new information including an updated Sex Offender Risk Assessment Score and a Level III assignment by the Rhode**

**Island Sex Offender Board of Review. Board members unanimously vote to rescind the prior grant of parole on the basis that parole would depreciate the seriousness of his offense and also find that he has an above average risk for sexual recidivism and is not an appropriate candidate for parole at this time. We do commend Mr. Hedstrom on the steps that he has made for his personal growth and encourage him to take this with him into the community at the expiration of his sentence.
