

Association. Although the question and answer period could have run longer, library hours require it end at 8:00pm. Jane said the CC needs to clarify the library's closing time and explore other options such as co-sponsoring with the Grange.

3. Passive Recreation Sites and Conservation Areas ordinance - Jane Harrison distributed copies of a Letter she sent to Town Council President David Frerichs. The letter contained changes and additions, proposed by CC members, to Town Code, Article IV, Passive Recreation Sites and Conservation Areas.

4. Bike Path and Hugh Cole Well - Dave Weed reported that Dorothy O'Neil and Walter Nebiker are working on the plaque. Walter is looking for a post card which contains a copy of the stolen plaque. David wants to see that before working up a new copy for the plaque. David will contact John Massed, Director of the DPW, requesting a sign be placed on the Bike Path to mark the location of the well, and will ask John the current cost of a park bench for the area. David will ask John who is responsible for the left side of 114 and the end of the Barrington/Warren bridge, containing a Welcome to Warren sign. It needs plantings and care.

5. Inventory of Detention/retention ponds - Pam reported she had not received an inventory from John Massed. David contacted John who said the inventory was being worked on, and was not yet complete.

6. RI Conservation Easement Guidance Manual - Prohibited Activities and Grantee revision of Town Code Article IV, Passive Recreation Sites and Conservation Areas. The CC's review is complete and sent to the town council president. Helen agreed the manual should be removed as an agenda item at this time.

New Business:

1. Company Street Scenic Waterfront Outlook - Guest Cynthia Henley did not arrive. The topic was tabled.

2. Flood Control Workshop - Helen attended the DEM workshop in Providence on May 18th. The workshop was an introduction to a discussion/planning process that will begin in September. RI's historic flood this year was exacerbated by the increase in impervious cover. The DEM welcomes recommendations to reduce impervious cover by planning and statute, and looks forward to working with town boards. Scott Millar presented.

3. Habitat Restoration - Fatima Drive Bob recused himself. Fatima Drive needs work: a new bench is needed, the mulch is needed it washed out; mountain laurel needs to be replanted, the bird boxes need to be emptied. One positive note - the adjacent homeowner is not mowing the lawn. David will ask John Massed to mulch the path from Fatima to the bench.

4. Storm Drain Marking - Bob proposed the CC concentrate on Metacom Ave. from the Bristol line to the end. The group will need two to three dry days in June to accomplish this. Jane proposed we work on Child Street when the construction is finished.

5. Community Garden - Kurt was not present.

Jane moved that there being no other business the meeting be adjourned. David seconded the motion. The meeting was adjourned at 8:45pm
