Jon Himlan tells the commission that beginning in April a flow study will begin in town and will be continuing for approximately 8 weeks. The purpose of this study is to see what flow changes have occurred

since 2004 the last flow assessment, also to see if there are any additional areas in town which should be of any concern. There are 15 areas in town where the flow monitoring will be taken place the areas are as follows:

Water Street at Wheaton (main interceptor)

Campbell Street

Water Street (main interceptor before WWTF)

South Main Street at Dyer

Warren Blvd

Market Street (to pump station)

Parker Avenue at Bay

North Main Street at Mill

Water Street at Washington

Franklin Street at Avenue A

Metacom Avenue

South Main Street

Market Street from North Pump Station

Market Street to East Pump Station

These flow meters will remain in manholes for approximately 8 weeks.
