Contract #3

Allstate will perform pipe lining on Market Street and Water Street but is waiting for payment from last completed job before they begin.

Flow metering

All metering is completed and Woodard & Curran is preparing the report.

Inflow Study

All dye testing is complete. Woodard & Curran attempted to dye test 60 buildings that were found to be suspect. 48 confirmed to not be an inflow source. 2 were found to have inflow sources 34 Coomer Avenue and 74 King Street and 10 were inconclusive.

Facility Plan Update

Woodard & Curran would like to do a workshop with the Town Manager prior to October 1st due to Mr. Abbruzzi leaving

Town Beach/Water Street Sewer

Woodard & Curran presented the Town Council with a proposal to the sewer line that runs in front of the beach. This was approved on September 8, 2008 meeting. Woodard & Curran met with Fuss & O'Neil and the Town Manager last week. The proposal that was presented is also presented to the Sewer Commission for approval. Brian Remy and William Rabideau sign the paperwork to begin the work. Dave Komiega will hold on to it so Dave Johnson can sign it.

Capacity Management

With the flow metering Woodard & Curran will start developing a capacity management spreadsheet. Woodard & Curran is recommending adding permanent flow meters and they will also complete the sewer ordinance.

Brian Remy tells John Himlan he would like to get Market Street done before the winter. Dave Komiega give the commission 4 proposals for the Market Street job. Machado Landscaping \$19,072.00, Tattrie Trucking \$30,750.25, International Paving \$30,750.25 and Pawtuket Asphalt \$30,800.00. After the commission reviews the proposals it was discovered that Machado Landscaping did not include enough material to do the job and also no police detail. Tehey were called in

and attended a meeting with Mr. Machado who after the meeting with the commission decided that he was unaware exactly how big the job was and decided to back out. The job then was voted and awarded to Tattrie Trucking who was the next lowest bid.

Dave Komiega gives a bill for Winfield Peterson for the work he has been doing for his consultation for the commission on the work regarding the Bristol County Water Authority. Commission agrees to pay bill.
