- **A public appeal is being launched this week for the Peckham Lot fundraising campaign. Scott Morrison review the need for an additional \$75,000 to be raised to assist in funding the project. The donations will be tax deductible. He encouraged residents to donate if they were able to this worthy project.**

- **A copy of an audit conducted by Access/RI entitled “Access Limited” was supplied to the Town Clerk. This audit report shows Little Compton favorably responding to Access to Public Records Requests and in compliance with the new laws to have a designated Public Records Officer certified, with a written procedure in place. For 2014 the municipal records custodian a/k/a the Town Clerk, the Police Department and the School District were all in compliance. Councilor Mushen recognized the efforts of the Town Clerk to keep the Town in compliance. The Police Department was also acknowledged for their quick response to public records requests.**

Motion made by Councilor Mataronas, receiving a second by Councilor Appleton, voting in favor (Appleton, Bodington, Golembeske, Mataronas, Mushen): To appoint Thomas Alder, Mark Cady and Scott Morrison to serve as trustees on the Little Compton Municipal Trust for a two year term.

Council President Mushen asked if his fellow Councilors were still in agreement with the draft goals proposed for the Comprehensive Plan review being conducted. No additional comments or concerns were raised. Councilor Mataronas reminded the Council of his previous comments regarding the protection of the harbor goal to build northern wave attenuation in the harbor. Mike Steers, Planning Board Chair mentioned that the Town has until June 2015 to comply with the interim standards to update our expired Comprehensive Plan. This update should simplify the goals and action items. No votes were taken.

The Solarize Little Compton Team from RI Office of Energy Resources has created a Request for Proposals for the installation of the solar

panels. Incentives will be offered to residents who agree to have the solar panels facing further west than the normal south facing option. The benefit of the west facing panels is to reap more solar power during the peak usage days of summer when Nationalgrid faces its heaviest burden with serving electricity to the area. The goal of this program is to relieve the need to have the Tiverton substation upgraded to handle the growing energy burden. Councilor Mushen noted that the Town will need to appoint three residents to participate in the proposal evaluations with the state team members. Mr. Bruce Gavin has been asked to consider serving in this capacity. Mr. Gavin commented that the program could benefit residents in the area who have previously expressed a desire to pursue solar energy options.

A town resident mentioned that a federal tax credit is currently available to receive 30% of the cost of installation but only for a short period is this incentive offered.

Hilary Woodhouse of Stay at Home addressed the Council concerning van sponsorship and rider fees for the new senior van. The Stay at Home group will organize and coordinate the dispatching and drivers for van. Margaret Tirpaeck has been hired to coordinate ride requests and scheduling of the van. A tentative schedule planned is as follows:

Monday, Wednesday and Fridays – take riders to the LC Community Center for lunch

Tuesday – trips to Lee’s Market and the Pharmacy

Thursday – trips to North Dartmouth Mall

Other opportunities will be for rides potentially to the food pantry, the Wellness Center, Walmart, or other venues. They continue to look for volunteer drivers and recognize the potential need to hire a driver for times where volunteers are not available. This stage of the program is considered phase I, in phase II the group will look to offer times to meet individual senior needs. Stay at Home is looking to solicit sponsorship of the program offering for a fee a magnetic sign to be placed on the rear of the van acknowledging the sponsor of the senior transportation program. Ridership fees are also being considered. Westport, MA charges a \$3 fee to ride their van with a reduced fee for a round trip ride. Mr. Woodhouse proposes offering to take a donation with a stated suggested amount, but leaving the donor to choose if they can afford to pay or not. The van will have the Town’s seal acknowledging it as a Town vehicle. Stay at Home would like to have a logo placed on the van as well acknowledging their management of the program.

Councilor Mataronas thanked Mr. Woodhouse for all of his work to expand the senior transportation program. Councilor Mushen also expressed the Councils gratitude to Francisco Silva who has faithfully supported and fought to assure that transportation is offered to Little Compton seniors.

WHEREAS, elimination of the tax on Social Security benefits would potentially keep Rhode Island residents from relocating elsewhere and would improve the overall Rhode Island economy with residents staying and buying their goods and services here in the state; and

WHEREAS, the elimination of the State tax on Social Security benefits would create a revenue shortfall of about one quarter of one percent; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the Little Compton Town Council hereby urges passage of legislation by the Rhode Island General Assembly during the upcoming 2015 legislation session repealing the tax on Social Security benefits.
