7. Liquor License Violation – McKinley’s Pub (November 30, 2017)

“On 11/30/17, at approximately 1730 hours, I Officer Mourato #273 was advised by Captain Michailides to conduct a liquor law check on McKinley’s Pub due to the concern of possible underage drinking taking place at this establishment.

It should be noted that on 11/17/17, East Greenwich Police took a report (17-186-AR) of a 20 year old male identified as Joseph Delgiulio was charged by EGPD for Vandalism/Malicious Injury to Property at the East Greenwich Yacht Club at 10 Water Street in East Greenwich. Delgiulio was suspected of removing boat stands from underneath and almost causing the boat to fall over. EGPD’s investigation discovered that Delgiulio was intoxicated and admitted to consuming alcohol at McKinley’s Pub.

I conducted the liquor law check and spoke with bartender/manager Danielle Duscheneau. I requested to review their underage book and was unable to find any pertinent information related to the Delgiulio incident. Secondly, I requested video surveillance of 11/17/17 and I was advised that it would be a couple of days in order to download the footage to a DVD. Danielle also explained to me that during the weekends the establishment hires private security who stand at both entrances and checks patron's ID's upon entering. Danielle also stated that if a patron appears to be young or close to 21 the bartenders will ask a second time for their ID's. However, Danielle's concern was that many under age subjects are using fake ID cards that are difficult to intercept.

This report will be forwarded to Captain Michailides for review."

Due to the aforementioned facts, the management of McKinley's Pub is in violation of the following rules and regulations issued by the Board of Public Safety for the orderly operation of liquor establishments."

16. STATE LAW AND REGULATIONS: These regulations are in addition to State Law and regulations to which all licenses are subject.

RIGL 3-8-5 Penalty for violations relating to underage persons. – Any person who sells or suffers to be sold or delivered any beverage to a person who has not reached his or her twenty-first (21st) birthday either for his or her own use or the use of his or her parents of any other person, or allows any other person who has not reached his or her twenty-first (21st) birthday to drink beverages on premises licensed under this title or suffers or allows any persons who have not reached their eighteen (18th) birthday to sell or serve any beverage on the premises shall for the first offense be subject to a fine of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250); for the second offense, be subject to a fine of five hundred dollars (\$500), and the for third and any subsequent offense, be subject to a fine of seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750). In the event that there are no offenses in three (3) successive years from the date of the last offense, then the next offense shall be treated as a first offense. Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to prevent licensees from hiring any person who has reached his or her eighteenth birthday.

Colonel McCartney: We recommended approval pending building and fire and discussion?

Chairwoman Baxter: And discussion; okay, you go first.

Mr. David Miller: It's just a tent outside like last year.

Chairwoman Baxter: Okay, any questions about that?

Mr. David Messier: No questions about that but are we going to do the same thing about parking? The other thing is it possible that they can put like a snow fence up where the fence is all broken down? Just so the people aren't walking in and out in the back. The fences all got blown down last fall in the storms and I guess the landlord said they were going to do it this spring or whatever. A lot of it is in one person's yard and a lot of the rest is down. Just wondering if they could put up some kind of a snow fence up just to keep the traffic from coming in and out.

Chairwoman Baxter: Okay. Parking. What are you doing for parking?

Mr. Miller: Nothing. Same as last year.

Chairwoman Baxter: Is last year when they were parking across the street and they had a detail? I can't remember.

Mr. Miller: Nope. We didn't do anything last year because we were getting a big snow storm.

Chairwoman Baxter: That's right, okay. All right, so parking is just in his lot it sounds like, right?

Mr. Miller: Yup.

Ms. Dianne Wilson: Okay.

Mr. Messier: Are they going to be parking on the side streets or anything like that?

Clerk McGovern: Two years ago - -

Mr. Miller: [interposing] We had no bans or anything.

Ms. Sharon Lupo: Didn't we have the parking on one side last year too?

Mr. Miller: Nope. We didn't do anything. We cancelled everything.

Ms. Lupo: Oh, that's right.

Mr. Messier: [inaudible] through the neighborhood.

Ms. Wilson: Just, just, okay this is what I think. Somebody should just keep an eye and make sure the emergency trucks can get through. That's very important.

Clerk McGovern: I kind of think you should do parking on one side.

Ms. Wilson: Yeah, they should be.

Mr. Messier: The year before for St. Patrick's Day they had the parking just on one side of the street. You know that's all we're asking is that's done.

Mr. Miller: Then we'll have Mobile Fencing do a temporary fence. We fence most of the lot in but we'll have them do it across the back since the fence is destroyed. I mean, I don't own the building so we're just going to do temporary fencing down the side.

Chairwoman Baxter: Great. Colonel, how do we go about having parking on one side?

Colonel McCartney: Well, I'll have to institute it. I guess the question is are you going to have the same crowd there? That's my only question. If you don't have live entertainment, that's an inducement. That's probably why the original recommendation was only building and fire. I don't know if it's really going to be the same, I would have to question if we're going to have the same amount of people going there.

Mr. Miller: I mean last year wasn't an issue.

Vice Chairman Paolucci: Did you have a detail last year?

Mr. Miller: Nope, no details.

Colonel McCartney: No details.

Chairwoman Baxter: Because he cancelled the entertainment.

Mr. Messier: On regular St. Patrick's Day - -

Ms. Lupo: [interposing] We've always had.

Colonel McCartney: You have, but you've had live entertainment before, which brings a completely different component here.

Ms. Lupo: When Felix --

Mr. Messier: [interposing] When Felix had Shannon View Inn and when the other guy before Dave was there; every St. Patrick's Day the neighborhood has been jammed with cars.

Colonel McCartney: It's difficult to bring up Felix. Felix has been gone for a long time. There's a much different component there. What we have been dealing with before is live entertainment with a tent. The question, and it certainly is a question in my mind, whether a parking plan is necessary. I just don't know to be quite frank with you.

Mr. Messier: Does that mean we can call the Department of there are people driving all over our grass because they can't get the cars up and down the street?

Colonel McCartney: Well, the reports I get from all of my officers is that it's been a while since we had anybody parking on the grass.

Mr. Messier: I had them last year.

Colonel McCartney: Well, that wasn't reported back to me sir.

Mr. Messier: I went right up to the officer at that top of the street when we got back they had driven away. So, nothing was said or done. But I'm just saying - -

Colonel McCartney: [interposing] Last year, it couldn't have been last year sir because it didn't happen last year. So, can we get our stories straight here please?

Mr. Messier: They had another thing that was there last year. As I said, every time they have a thing there they have a parking ban; now you're not going to do the parking?

Colonel McCartney: It's not my decision to make here because I'm just questioning it. It was not among the original plan here because this is a different component. We do not have live entertainment and that's the question here. If I am directed by the Board to set up a parking plan then I will dually do what I am told to do. But, that's my question. I don't know.

Chairwoman Baxter: Did you have parking issues last year at all?

Mr. Miller: No. Last year I believe, and don't hold me to this, but last year I think me and Matt Barlow drove around and I think Matt put up signs. I'm sorry, Officer Barlow.

Colonel McCartney: If you want, just out of an abundance of caution, I will put two people on City detail out there. Once again, I take my direction from the Board.

Chairwoman Baxter: Can we just have it so it's just parking on one side, we don't need a detail?

Colonel McCartney: If that's what the Board wants; parking on one side. We still have to have somebody out there I suppose. I could still put somebody out there on a City detail just to make sure it's being enforced, out of an abundance of caution.

Chairwoman Baxter: Okay

Colonel McCartney: Okay. Once again, compared to a lot of years we were dealing with the live entertainment component. This year it's very different with only the tent to deal with and no live entertainment. I just question it, but that's fine. I'll do what the Board wants me to do.

Crosstalk is heard.

Chairwoman Baxter: So, it's behind the building?

Mr. Miller: It's just a small one.

Mr. Messier: So if they're putting a tent in the back and they're gating off the whole parking lot, where are people going to park?

Chairwoman Baxter: He didn't say he was gating off the parking lot. He didn't say that. We can make it so there's parking on only one side of the street. I mean we can't close the streets down.

Mr. Messier: No, we're just asking for one side.

Ms. Lupo: One side would be great.

Chairwoman Baxter: I think that's fair considering there's not going to be entertainment. I don't see what's so fun about standing out in the cold if there's no music out there.

Mr. Miller: [inaudible] for warm weather.

Ms. Lupo: The only point I was trying to make that was even when Felix did St. Patrick's Day there; it's always very busy on St. Patrick's Day. Try to get into any Irish Pub anywhere in the State. It's very, very busy. If you happen to live in the neighborhood behind the business, people are parking on both sides of the street, they're parking on your lawn; it doesn't matter who owns it or who's running it; it is always that way. That's was my point.

Chairwoman Baxter: All right. We can do it so it's parking on one side of the street for sure.

Colonel McCartney: Once again, I will offer to put two officers out there on City detail, which comes out of my budget.

Chairwoman Baxter: Gotcha.

Colonel McCartney: And um - -

Mr. Messier: [inaudible] detail. I mean - -

Chairwoman Baxter: [interposing] No, no, no. He just said it's City detail so they're going to just be out there checking around.

Colonel McCartney: City detail.

Mr. Messier: There's no sense for it to come out of your budget though. We haven't really had that much of a problem. It's just once they start parking on both sides of the streets.

Colonel McCartney: Well, if we're gonna have complaints, then I'm gonna have to somebody respond to the complaints. Like I said, I have a city to worry about; I don't have one street to worry about, okay. I have a city to worry about. If one minute were thinking something's going to happen then like I said, I'll meet the situation half way. It's a different component. With all due respect, Ma'am; I don't necessarily agree with you. It's a different component when you don't have live entertainment. But, that having been said, I will offer to enforce it on one side and put city two police officers out there on a city detail.

Chairwoman Baxter: Okay, I think that's reasonable.

Colonel McCartney: I think that's more that reasonable.

Vice Chairman Paolucci: May I ask a question?

Chairwoman Baxter: Yeah. Absolutely.

Vice Chairman Paolucci: Dave, is the entrance to the tent accessed through the entrance to your building first or through the back of the property?

Mr. Miller: It's on the property. It's usually from the back door. They go out back door and then on to the patio and then on to the deck. The tent goes half in the parking lot and half over the patio.

Vice Chairman Paolucci: So they'll be ID'd at the front door?

Mr. Miller: Correct. They funnel through the front door and there are two people there for IDs.

Chairwoman Baxter: Okay, is that it?

Nothing is heard.


