Colonel McCartney: I suppose the one question I have is this something that is going to continue on a regular basis?

Mr. Henry Vermette: Yeah.

Chairwoman Baxter: So every Saturday and Sunday night?

Mr. Vermette: Yes, every Saturday and Sunday. The barmaid is there just on Friday nights and Saturday and after she gets off and by the time the band gets out then it's tough for her to get back in the morning.

Colonel McCartney: Are you serving breakfast there now?

Mr. Vermette: Yeah. Just on Sundays.

Colonel McCartney: So how are you handling it now? Now you want to expand upon it, it that so?

Mr. Vermette: Yes, Saturdays also.

Colonel McCartney: Saturdays also.

Chairwoman Baxter: So you want to serve Saturdays and Sundays?

Mr. Vermette: Yeah [inaudible].

Chairwoman Baxter: So how are you getting it cleaned up now on a Saturday night to be ready for Sunday? Who's cleaning?

Mr. Vermette: She's been doing it right along.

Chairwoman Baxter: Is she the only one - -

Mr. Vermette: [interposing] What happened was I guess she requested and the Captain that was on duty this time, he used to let my son stay there. I'm just getting it from my son because. I'm sorry; I just got back from Florida.

Chairwoman Baxter: No, it's okay. Too bad for you, ha?

Mr. Vermette: I guess he said he never had a problem; no one has ever bothered him. But anyway, this one Commander I guess said hey look, as far as we're concerned you can leave at 2:00 a.m.; which don't get me wrong, I've always abided by it, because you know, that the way the rules are. But, I guess he figured - -

Colonel McCartney: [interposing] My only concern is that is there some assurance that this isn't going to be abused. If you start allowing that on a regular basis, because right now the rule that we have is that you have to call in and get permission from the Officer in Charge.

Mr. Vermette: That's what he'd been doing.

Colonel McCartney: That allows us to make sure that you're doing what you're supposed to be doing. You don't want us all of a sudden; if I agree to the Board to allow this to happen every weekend, are we going to find out people are drinking in there instead of cleaning up?

Mr. Vermette: No because what we do is once [inaudible] left, we lock the doors and it's mostly just my son and her.

Colonel McCartney: We will still hold your feet to the fire if you're looking for me to recommend permission to the Board, who makes the decision, that I'm still going to have the police officers stop in there and check to make sure that at 1:00 a.m. you've got the people out of there and all you're doing is just cleaning up.

Mr. Vermette: All right.

Colonel McCartney: If you're satisfied with that Madame Chair then I'll withdraw any concern I have.

Clerk McGovern: With all due respect, I have some concern that every bar in the City of Warwick is busy at closing time and there's other opportunities to clean up their bar; whether that means come in at 5:00 a.m. to clean up for the 7:00 a.m. breakfast. What time do you open for breakfast?

Mr. Vermette: 7:00 a.m.

Clerk McGovern: 7:00 a.m., so the other option is that you could come in at 5:00 a.m. and do whatever cleaning is going to take place after 2:00 a.m. I think it's an invitation to; to everybody. You're here today and next week we could have 12 more bars here and 12 more bars, and 12 more bars. So, you know there's been a policy and procedure in place for a number of years that you call in and ask for that extension. So, my suggestion is that we have, we have to come up with an alternative. We understand it's busy, the bands are playing, it's when you make your best money at the end of the night. But, there's other options coming in at 5:00 a.m. I understand that if the girl's closing at 2:00 a.m. she's not going to want to come in at 5:00 a.m. but there might have to be another clean up. My vote is going to be to follow the current procedure we have. If there is an issue, you call and ask the officer in charge and they'll make a decision. So, that's how I feel about it. You guys have your own opinion.

Chairwoman Baxter: Yup.

Vice Chairman Paolucci: How many employees do you have at closing time?

Mr. Vermette: How many people are in there?

Clerk McGovern: How many employees? Like your son, the bartender.

Mr. Vermette: Just my son and her. Then he gives her a ride home when they're done.

Chairwoman Baxter: Maybe there's got to be, just for those two nights, maybe there's got to be an extra person or like Mr. McGovern said maybe someone's got to come in earlier the next day because if we

allow it for every single weekend; you might not need it every single weekend, you might be done early one night. If there's bad weather you might not have to stay open that late. So, it's better, it sounds like; it seems like a better idea just to call in for the nights you need. They approve it. If they don't, you're going to have to come in earlier the next morning, because there are other bars that serve breakfast. I can think of a couple off hand that serve breakfast in the mornings on the weekends. They're not in here. It is an invitation to trouble or something. A lot of times when people come in for, if there's been a problem with the bar, it's been the afterhours crew that's in the bar. They're drinking or whatever.
