NEW BUSINESS

• State School Construction Referendum.

<u>MOTION</u>: 1) Theresa Spengler, 2) Liana Fenton. *That the School Committee move discussion regarding the State School Construction Referendum to the end of the agenda.* Unanimous vote.

OLD BUSINESS

- Strategic Plan Mrs. Kraeger said that the school department needs to go out to bid for a facilitator. Due to prior commitments, the facilitator originally scheduled is not available.
- Bond Projects Mr. Fontes will update the committee during Superintendent's Reports.

ACTION ITEMS

LINE ITEM ADJUSTMENTS

MOTION: 1) Theresa Spengler, 2) Liana Fenton. *That the School Committee approve the Line Item Adjustments.* Unanimous vote.

The only line items that are being adjusting are from general fund capital and a few private donations. At the next meeting, adjustments with revenue and grants will be introduced. Once finalized, changes to revenue will be brought back at the next meeting.

Adjustments approved tonight with align with the quarterly report. Adjustments include:

- General Fund Adjustments for estimated retiree contractual buyouts and after school/other stipends.
- Capital Fund Adjustments for Special Education, repair and maintenance, athletics, conferences, workshops, purchased property services, and school construction line items.
- Private Donations/State Categoricals Adjustments for private donations from PTG organizations and Feinstein Foundation. There is also an adjustment in State Categorical for English Language Learners.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

• Curriculum - Mrs. Savastano reported that the School Department is awaiting approval of a CTE Trust grant for \$50K. A \$150K equity CTE grant has also been submitted. The decision is expected in June. We are also waiting on approval of the Engineering and Computer Science Pathways.

RICASS testing in grades 3-8 has begun. The window for ELA testing is April 2 – May 4 and the window for Math testing is April 3 – May 25. SATSD Primary test date is April 10, 2018. The makeup test date is April 24, 2018. One April 10th, the grade 9 students will attend a field trip and grade 12 students will participate in Senior Support Day where they will receive Capstone support, assistance with scholarships, and listen to a guest speaker from URI. This is paid for by the State. The participation rate needs to be 95%, which is difficult when there is only one testing day and one makeup day, but Middletown is currently at 96% without the makeup day. Snacks, breakfast, and a bag lunch were provided for the 9th grade field trip. Mrs. Savastano thanked all for their support.

- **Financial** Ms. Pellerin reported that as of February 28th, 94% of the budget has been spent or encumbered. The March 31st report will be sent to the transparency portal. A webinar was held today where the Governor announced the transparency portal will go live on April 24th. Information is being finalized with OpenGov and Workiva. We need to make sure there is a consolidated budget available for viewing electronically before the April 28, 2018 meeting.
- Facilities Mr. Fontes requested from the Town to have intruder locks moved up to this fiscal year. The Aquidneck School LED project is 97% complete. Low use areas and closets still need to be addressed.

Bond Projects – The Aquidneck main entrance reconfiguration project will make the building ADA accessible. The handicapped ramp will be on the left side of the building. A new vestibule with two locking doors could be added. Once a person has gained entrance through the first locked door, they would still need access through the second door. Bulletproof glass would be installed. Mr. Fontes has met with Principal Fonseca and the safety group. A district-wide safety assessment will take place on April 20, 2018.

Gaudet School was originally first in cue for front entrance reconfiguration. After review it was determined that the work, which includes HVAC and plumbing, was more extensive than originally thought and would not be completed in time. It was decided to address the Aquidneck School work first. A parent questioned that if there is not enough time now to complete the project, how can there be time next year. Mr. Fontes said that waiting will allow more time for the drawings to be developed and approved by RIDE. Mrs. Spengler suggested installing another camera at a different angle.

Bids for roof projects are due on April 23, 2018. There will be a brief meeting for bid approval on April 26th at Gaudet Library, prior to the PTG Meeting.

Statewide Bond Referendum – Senator DiPalma will attend the May 17, 2018 meeting to discuss the referendum. Any project that broke ground after January 1, 2018 would be eligible for 5% reimbursement. Middletown needs to make sure it receives funding, not just the urban cities.

Mrs. Kraeger reported that a voter registration drive took place at Middletown High School today. The Secretary of State was in attendance and spoke with students.
