On June 20th, the Truck Committee met with KME Fire Apparatus.

The Fire Department received grants from The House of Representatives and The Senate, both totaling \$2000.00.

All PM's have been completed. No major repairs to report.

On July 6, the Chief attended the funeral of Chief Raymond Blackmore of the Chopmist Hill Fire Department. On July 12, he attended the Swearing - in Ceremony for Chief Joseph Bourquin of the Nasonville Fire Department.

On July 26, Rivers Paving, seal- coated the driveway at the Summit Station.

On July 14, The Fire Department responded to 2095 Harkney Hill Road for a camper fire. Crews arrived on scene to find a 26' camper fully involved. Mutual Aid was called in to assist. The fire is being investigated by FF Edward Blanchard. On July 17, The Fire Department responded to Plainfield Pike at Watermen Hill Road for a reported auto fire. On scene Engine-8 found an auto fully involved. The fire is being investigated by FF Edward Blanchard. On July 18, The Fire Department responded to Nicholas Farm Management Area for a reported auto fire. Crews arrived on scene to find an auto fully involved. The fire is being investigated by FF Edward Blanchard, Coventry Police Department, R.I. State Fire Marshal and R.I. State Police K-9 Unit. On July 18, the Chief attended a meeting at Coventry Police Headquarters regarding the two auto fires.

A motion is made by Mr. Holt and seconded by Mr. Farnum to accept the June and July Chief's report.

Mr. Mays asked if the break-ins and car fires were related. The Chief responded, no.

Mr. Holt asks what quint training is. It is to get rating for ladder trucks as part of ISO.

June 10, 11 and 12 the department assisted Quonset Fire Department with the Air Show. We sent Tanker-18, Unit-8 and Rescue-9. The Chief would like to thank the Members who assisted; he received positive feedback from there Command Staff on the professionalism of our Members. The Department gets reimbursed with fuel for working the air show.

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Mr. Holt asks about the grants from Senator Kettle and Rep Chippendale. The money was spent on NFPA reference library. Mr. Farnum likes that the grants were spent on fire safety. The Chief likes to spend the grants on safety items. He will write thank you letters. Mr. Mays says that Legislature requires a request for the grant and what it will be spent on. He suggests in the next budget process grants and uses be discussed.

We have a new Dry Hydrant on Hopkins Hollow Road. The Hydrant is located on the Lockwood property. Mr. Humble asked if a letter was sent to Mr. Lockwood regarding the dry hydrant and Mr. Depasquale for radios. The Chief will be sending letters.

Mr. Humble asks if there was resolution of where the ISO money will come from. The dry hydrant program will be included in the next budget. DPW agreed to do work on Hammet Road and the department will have to pay cost for materials \$854.36 with this year's DEM grant and push back Sisson Road project. The Chief will apply for another DEM grant next year. The overall objective is to get four certified hydrants within 32 square miles.

Greene campground solar energy project plans were received yesterday. The land was sold to a developer. There are NFPA standards for shut offs and labeling. Mr. Mays asks if our members have high voltage experience. The Chief wants to speak to the developer regarding shut offs and feeds. Mr. Hevey says solar panels produce DC which is constant. If someone comes in contact, it causes muscle contraction and you can't let go. Someone will have to pull you from it. The turbines are moderate voltage. Most of the poles out here are 6.6 and the turbines are higher than 13. Mr. Hevey spoke with Mr. Depasquale who offered a tour to the BOD and the boy scouts. Mr. Hevey explains home solar panels.

Mr. Hevey says most of edispatch has improved.

All districts are considering getting on the same software to share with fire alarm. CCFD would purchase and we would get a user license off of the program on the same network. Fire Alarm is working off of index cards. Chief Brown is discussing a joint grant to upgrade the system. Mr. Hevey asked if money from the Towns radio fund can be spent for that. The cost could be \$30,000 or more.

Captain Mann and the Chief are working on unit 8.

Mr. Humble asked for rescue recovery schedule. He also asked about an AC duct in rescue 8. The Chief will respond.

The yard is being cleaned up and the boat is gone. There will be a bonfire in mid fall to get rid of the Christmas trees.

Run 161 had a 12 minute response. Mr. Humble was puzzled that he didn't see mutual aid. The Chief says mutual aid is called within five minutes. Mr. Hevey said the second call went out close to ten minutes. The Chief said it was a brush fire/smoke in the area. The first alarm a defensive stance was set up on Hazard Road. There was another run for smoke in the area. The following day we were following smoke in the area.

The Chairman will be added as a second signature with requirement there be two signatures on checks \$10,000 and over and for \$1,000 and over on tax collector accounts. A motion is made by Mr. Bousquet and seconded by Mr. Farnum to approve the financial audit. Mr. Hevey questions unsecured money in the account. Mr. Underwood says it’s not unusual because Centreville Bank is insured. He will ask if they offer outside additional insurance.
