Mr. Gregory: There were periodic emails and I am separating the school from the central office that have been inconsistent. Accountability only rests in one place. Move your kid if you do not like it.

Dr. Filippelli: Communication has to go both ways. Since the 9/16 meeting, the only 2 parents that contacted me are the parents that wanted their children moved. I was communicating to Mr. Byerlee. Since the initial meeting on 9/16/16, not one parent who signed that letter has contacted me either by email or phone to set up a meeting about the 4<sup>th</sup> grade. I have been in constant contact with Mr. Byerlee about the issue. So from the time of the meeting on 9/16 up through 2/27/17 when the letter was written, there has been no communication with the superintendent's office until tonight.

Mr. Scacco: Question for Larry, what actions have been taken with the problem children?

Mr. Byerlee: Discipline is not just about punishment. We have been working with the parents and the students.

Mr. Scacco: These parents know?

Mr. Byerlee: I hear all of the concerns and we are working hard every day and if there is a communication issue I will own that. I am in those classrooms up to 3 times a day. Teachers are telling me that things are better. We have hard work to do every day and we are doing it.

Mr. LaPlante: Set an action plan, it is unacceptable that a student needs to be moved from a school. We cannot go back in time. We need vigilant follow-up. I would like to have weekly reporting as well. A plan for next year so there is no slippage.

Mrs. Dias: We are moving to a culture that people feel comfortable to raise issues.

Mr. LaPlante: I like to hear what the kids and the teachers have to say.

Mrs. Clemence: I thought the children should have come to this meeting. We do not know what they are feeling.

Mr. LaPlante: I have to trust Dr. Filippelli; and I do not know if his going into the classroom for an hour is effective.

Mrs. Dias: The presence of our leadership is important and should be visible.
