FIRE TRUCK COMMITTEE MEETING
MARCH 16, 2016

1.Call to Order

The District Truck Committee meeting of the Misquamicut Fire District was called to order by Chairman Doug Turnberg at 3:00 pm
Committee Members present: Todd Findeisen, Holly Sisco-Bowen, Rebecca Colucci, Doug Turnberg, and Mike Misto. Andy Delisio was absent.

2. Approval of Minutes from the Feb. 27, 2016

A motion was made by Todd Findeisen and Seconded by Rebecca Colucci to accept the minutes from the Feb. 27, 2016. The motion passed unanimously.

3.Review of Third Party Report of Engine 202 (See Attached Report)

Todd Findeisen presented the Committee with the Third Party Review of Engine 202 done by Shipman's Fire Apparatus of Waterford, CT. They found that 202 does not meet 13 of 25 current standards of NFPA 1901 & 1911. The report also states NFPA 1901, Annex D: Frontline apparatus no more than 15 years in age, 25 years of age out of service completely.

A motion was made by Todd Findeisen and Seconded by Mike Misto to accept the Report by Shipman's Fire Apparatus. The Motion passed unanimously

4.Committee Recommendation to District on Engine 202

A motion was made by Todd Findeisen and Seconded by Rebecca Colucci that the Committee recommends that the Misquamicut Fire District purchase a new Pumper to replace Engine 202 based on the information received and discussed. The vote was unanimous.

5.Review of New Pumper Specification from Fire Department Truck Committee

Mike Misto presented the Committee with some Specifications that the Fire Department Truck Committee is working on with some Fire Apparatus Manufacturers. Some key highlights are:

- Trying to keep truck setup similar to Engine 203
- No longer than 32' and taller than 9'10"
- 6 person cab with 5 SCBA seats
- 1750gpm Hale Pump
- 750 gallon water tank
- 35' ground ladder instead of standard 24'
- 6kw hydraulic generator
- Class A/B Foam system with 30gal. Tank
- 1200' 5" supply hose
- 500' 3" supply hose
- 500' 2 ½" attack hose
- 800' 1 ¾" attack hose
- Larger intermediate rear step for firefighter safety

- Full depth compartments for more storage space
- Brighter LED scene lights for added safety at night

Some discussion followed.

A motion was made by Doug Turnberg and Seconded by Mike Misto to accept the Preliminary Specification from the Fire Department Truck Committee. The Vote was unanimous.
