BUSINESS BROUGHT BEFORE THE COUNCIL

4. A3b-Received From Scott Humphrey Regarding Planner Position

Councilor Pelletier commented on the letter received from Scott Humphrey, Chair of the Economic Development Committee (EDC) and a local business owner and resident. The strongly worded letter relates to the process of the Planner selection. Most specifically mentions how Kate Michaud was treated during and throughout the

process. Councilor Pelletier cited the need to not go down the path of dehumanizing the process, was disturbed, doesn't want anyone to feel they are mistreated. Councilor Pelletier personally apologized to anyone especially Ms. Michaud, endeavored to do better. Councilor Arruda was not sure how he contributed to this, was not sure about the zero compensation, recalled a contract for an Acting Town Planner. Councilor Lambert did contact Mr. Humphrey, might not have all the facts. Asked the Town Clerk to put on for Executive Session at the earliest possible opportunity to get an appropriate time table of events. Requested Town Administrator Wojcik to provide the Council with a breakdown over the last two months. Agreed with Councilor Pelletier some processes can be politicized, was disgraceful. Councilor Arruda was not sure how things happened, what role the Councilors played. President Roderick was privileged to work with Ms. Michaud when Federal and State representatives looked at the Industrial Park. Praised her professionalism, her knowledge. Was also upset about the process, was politicized. Was grateful for the hard work done by Ms. Michaud especially as the Planner. Extend apologies to Ms. Michaud, thanked her for all her hard work. Losing Ms. Michaud would be a great loss.

Councilor Pelletier made a motion, seconded by Councilor deMedeiros to Receive and File item 4.A3b- Received From Scott Humphrey Regarding Planner Position. Motion passed unanimously.

B-PUBLIC HEARINGS & PUBLIC PRESENTATIONS:

1. Chief Blakey- Proposed Traffic Ordinance Section 78-114, Through Traffic on Jiley Hill Road – Prohibiting Traffic Between the Hours of 3:00 pm and 6:00 pm Except for Individuals Living Thereon or Visiting Residences

Police Chief Thomas Blakey explained a traffic study was done for the intersection of Fish Road and Bulgarmarsh Road found 25-30 cars backed up at any one time. Have requested a street light, intersection meets the criteria, takes 44 seconds to get through the intersection. Neighbors living in that area find cars are cutting through for that right turn, is a safety hazard. Requesting the public not pass through between 3&6pm Monday through Friday. President Roderick called for comment from the public three times, hearing none opened to the Council. Councilor Gerlach supported the request, questioned when the light would be installed. Councilor Gerlach questioned what happens if someone goes to visit. Chief Blakey explained through traffic would be affected, visitors would be allowed. Chief Blakey anticipated installation in the spring of 2016, have discussed with DPW Director Steve Berlucchi putting a right hand turning lane, drainage in the area prohibits. Proper signage will be installed.

Councilor Gerlach made a motion, seconded by Councilor deMedeiros to Approve the New Traffic Ordinance Section 78-114, Through Traffic on Jiley Hill Road – Prohibiting Traffic Between the Hours of 3:00 pm and 6:00 pm Except for Individuals Living Thereon or Visiting Residences as demonstrated in Agenda item B1. E-UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

1. Councilor Roderick- Corrected Vote From October 27th Regarding Town Administrator Contract

President Roderick explained the Council vote from the October 27th meeting regarding the Town Administrator's contract was made incorrectly. It was for \$90,000, the T/A salary was already at \$90K, the Council needed to approve the 1.5% increase. Solicitor Teitz noted this was clarifying the vote that was to grant the raise as specified in the contract. It was a \$90K salary with an increase of 1.5% for the remaining 6 months so it would be an annualized salary of \$91,350 retroactive to August 25 which was the T/A six month employment anniversary. Do not have to rescind the vote just specify the amount.

Councilor Pelletier made a motion, seconded by Councilor deMedeiros to Correct the Vote from the October 27th meeting regarding the Town Administrator contract specifically the dollar amount of the annualized salary, \$91,350 retroactive to August 25, 2014. Motion passed unanimously.

Town Clerk/Municipal Court Clerk Nancy Mello informed the Council, have a Charter Complaint against the majority of the Council less Councilor Arruda. Municipal Court Judge James A, Donnelly, Jr. has recused himself from hearing this matter. Forwarded to Probate Court Judge Richard D'Addario, working on setting up a time for the hearing. Waiting to hear from Mr. O'Dell could be next Monday. Will let the Council know as soon as possible.

H-BIDS AND REQUESTS FOR PROPOSALS:

1. DPW Direct Stephen Berlucchi – Request Permission to Advertise for Bids to Purchase (2) Two, 40 Cubic Yard Roll-Off containers for the Landfill Recycling of Mattresses and Hard Plastics

DPW Director Berlucchi came before the Council 1.5 years ago to request 2 dumpsters for mattresses and hard plastics. There were enough mattresses to fill both dumpsters, now receiving tons of hard plastics. Today hauled 4 loads to Johnston, get roughly \$1,716 in recycling refunds. The expenditure has been approved by the Landfill/Recycling Committee from the restricted funds account. This is to also build up an inventory of dumpsters for when the landfill closes. Working with Open Space to find a suitable location. The dumpsters cost approximately \$5,000, account currently has \$76,000, set aside \$20K for recycling and trash bins for recreation facilities.

Councilor Gerlach made a motion, seconded by Councilor deMedeiros to grant permission for the DPW Director to Advertise for Bids to Purchase (2) Two, 40 Cubic Yard Roll-Off containers for the Landfill Recycling of Mattresses and Hard Plastics. Motion passed unanimously.

I-TOWN ADMINISTRATOR ITEMS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Administrator Wojcik explained the Judson Street Community Center will be dispensed, trying to move with haste. Encouraged by a number of inquiries, will be a sealed bid auction, won't know the numbers, minimum bid based on appraisal, hoping to advertise as soon as possible. On Monday, November 17 at 6:30 pm will be having a meeting of the Land Use Procedural Improvements Committee to discuss items from the workshop a few years ago. It was more of a complaints forum on zoning and planning issues. Went through the list, made punitive delegations to follow up on some issues. Some resolved by personnel changes, others need to be done by ordinance changes or the Comp Plan Update. Will put the packet on the website. Quite a few policies need to be written next year like recreation, need feedback and involvement from the public. Should have a field damage policy if there is no consensus for a field use policy. Need a comprehensive approach to Grinnell's with the work on the Stone Bridge Abutment. Recreation taking the lead. Message from Chief Blakey need to be aware of coyotes in Town, small pets out at night at risk, 2 incidents this weekend. Veteran's Day is a special day for all the veterans and relatives. 1. Alcohol Service – BYOB Potential Ordinance – Request for Council Direction

Solicitor Teitz explained this was continued from the last meeting in order to discuss with Chief Blakey the request for an ordinance. The Council has the power to regulate would need to adopt an ordinance, will prepare one upon Council direction. Chief Blakey explained, don't have anything to govern Bring Your Own Booze (BYOB), currently don't have to come before Council, has no fee, cannot regulate if there is no license. Should have the same type of process like the licensed liquor establishments, should have one on the books. Other cities and towns are similar to the BV license. Councilor deMedeiros questioned if Sandywoods would need one as they have similar events. To the Chief's knowledge no restaurant has been doing this. Not trying to put someone out of business. . Basically for someone opening a business and circumventing the law. Some towns do currently

have ordinances. Solicitor Teitz supported as well. President Roderick agreed, Council should direct the Solicitor to prepare a draft ordinance for the next Council.

Councilor deMedeiros made a motion, seconded by Councilor Pelletier to direct the Town Solicitor to prepare a draft Ordinance for Alcohol Service, BYOB. Motion passed unanimously.

Code of Ordinances – Chapter 78 – TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES: This amendment will revise parts of Chapter 78, as follows: **“Chapter 78-114, THROUGH TRAFFIC; PENALTY FOR VIOLATION OF SECTION,** The use of a motor vehicle in and upon the following street between the hours of 3:00 pm and 6:00 pm is hereby prohibited except for individuals living thereon or individuals visiting residences on such street. Nothing contained in this division shall affect the use of such street by any fire truck, town public works department trucks, police vehicles, ambulance or other vehicle using such street in any emergency, or any vehicle engaged in delivering goods, merchandise or material to or from any residence, building or lot within the immediate vicinity bordering on such street. Road signs shall be erected to provide adequate notice to motorists.

(1) Jiley Hill Road Section 78 Through Traffic

The operation of a motor vehicle contrary to this shall cause the imposition of a fine of \$40.00 per violation.
