**d. Award of Bid(s)**

- Fire Alarm Upgrades**

**Mrs. DiCenso asked Mr. Osterman to speak on behalf of the award of bids.**

**Mr. Knight arrived at 6:40 PM.**

**Mr. Osterman: We received three bids from Energy Electric Company, Encore Holdings LLC and AFA Protection Systems Inc. The apparent low bid was AFA Protection Systems, Inc. at \$157,000.00. Based on past experience we recommend the Fire Alarm Upgrade bid award to AFA Protection Systems, Inc. in the amount of \$157,000.00.**

**Mr. Charbonneau: I will add that AFA was the recommendation of the Facilities Subcommittee.**

**Mr. Osterman: Based on experiences with past projects, we felt it best to put in liquidated damages clause in contracts. This was written for \$1,000 a day for each day. It ensures construction is done on time. The other applies pressure to do the work on schedule as promised when they begin.**

**Mr. Araujo: During the facilities committee meeting, it was vetted that AFA is not from Pawtucket but there is a difference with the price. We hope more Pawtucket bidders come forward so we can award in the future. We're always keeping an eye out to purview and keep work in Pawtucket.**

**Mr. Charbonneau: This project was previously budgeted for plans drawn. The architect owns the plans. The recommendation of the**

**facilities subcommittee is to award this to SMMA, but not to exceed \$10,500 for the sake of time and ability to turn project around in the summer.**

**Ms. McQuade moved to approve the Separation of Domestic and Sprinkler Water Mains at Goff and Tolman to SMMA not to exceed \$10,500. Mr. Araujo seconded.**

**Mr. Knight: Just the design?**

**Mr. Charbonneau: Yes.**

**• Jenks HVAC Bid Review and Award**

**Mr. Charbonneau: For the sake of time we brought this to the full Committee before the Facilities Committee.**

**Mr. Osterman: We went out to bid for a mechanical renovation**

project at Jenks. The system is beyond repair and barely functioning and a few months ago we applied for and received \$2M funding. Of the three (3) bidders the bid from Automatic arrived later and couldn't be considered for this project. There was a considerable difference between the two remaining bids. Of the two remaining Delta is the apparent low bidder with a base bid of \$1,854,000.00; Alternate #1 hot water piping (add) \$933.00 and Alternate (2) reinforce steel under roof deck (deduct) (\$264,000.00) for a total bid of \$1,590,933.00. Arden's base bid came in at \$2,217,700.00; Alternate #1 hot water piping (add) \$29,800.00 and Alternate #2 reinforce steel under roof deck (deduct) (\$247,700.00) for a total bid of \$1,999,900.00. We took a good look at what was in line. The liquated damages clause is much higher in this project. We recommend to the apparent low bidder, Delta, in addition the bid will include 10% MBA and Delta will give 9% of work to Pawtucket contractors. The estimator who came up with the line item was not actual, the decimal point was moved but they will honor this.

Mr. Charbonneau: It should have been \$9,000.00?

Mr. Osterman: Yes.

Ms. McQuade moved to approve the Jenks HVAC bid award to Delta Mechanical Contractors, LLC with a base bid of \$1854,000.00; alternate #1 hot water piping (add) \$933.00 and Alternate #2 reinforce steel under roof deck (deduct) (\$264,000.00) for a total bid price of \$1,590,933.00. Ms. Bonollo seconded.

**Mr. Knight: What kind of piping are they using?**

**Mr. Osterman: I don't know.**

**Mrs. DiCenso: I ask you to amend this contingent on State approval.**

**Ms. McQuade moved to amend to approve the Jenks HVAC bid award to Delta Mechanical Contractors, LLC with a base bid of \$1854,000.00; alternate #1 hot water piping (add) \$933.00 and Alternate #2 reinforce steel under roof deck (deduct) (\$264,000.00) for a total bid price of \$1,590,933.00 contingent on pending state approval. Ms. Bonollo seconded.**

**e. Potential Bond Issuance Request**

**Mrs. DiCenso:** The Mayor asked us to come up with \$46M pre-approved and backed out \$32M and shovel ready and we came up with \$9M. We want to include the amount that we could re-apply to the Rhode Island Department of Education (RIDE) and put on the Governor's table. This helps you with the ability to obtain them. We went back to the safety issue and looked at the secondary schools to add into this bond.

**Ms. Devine:** The \$9M turned into \$12M and added contingency we came up to \$25M in total.

**Mrs. DiCenso:** We submitted a bond request of \$25M knowing we have to go through the State I process and bring before you.

**Mr. Charbonneau:** I think this speaks to the collaboration to the City side as well. The Mayor didn't just take the \$9M figure and recognizes more work needs to be done pending City Council approval and RIDE reimbursement. It's the right thing to do. The City and Schools are in a better spot.

**Mr. Araujo** moved to approve the \$25M bond request contingent on City Council approval and RIDE Reimbursement. **Ms. Bonollo**

**seconded.**

**Mr. Knight: We don't even have a list of projects. Historically, the City has underfunded our maintenance. The Council sends it to the legislature they approve to put it on the ballot. On the point we're voting, do we have both sides covered?**

**Mr. Charbonneau: They're the same steps prior to that and it goes to entities prior to the general assembly. It was very time sensitive and because of time constraints and ample time to discuss it tonight.**

**Mr. Knight: I'll ask then to put anything on the ballot. Typical Council approval went from \$6M to \$8M to \$25M? We're talking about what we're bonding.**

**Mr. Charbonneau: Mr. Araujo's motion sated contingent on Council approval and RIDE reimbursement. We wouldn't look to put the City in a bad situation.**

**Mrs. DiCenso: The request came from the Mayor's Office.**

**Mr. Araujo: The momentum is the overwhelming support from the \$32M bond from voters of the City of Pawtucket. There's a potential for \$60M statewide. We have the potential to get a lot of reimbursement on these projects.**

**Mrs. DiCenso:** We have to keep in mind that when the Facilities Committee did the assessment the \$32M is just a drop in the bucket compared to what projects need to be done. When you have an opportunity its \$273M in projects is important for us. You'll see the difference in the boiler at Goff. We've done millions of dollars in the fire upgrades. That's significant. It's essential for the safety of kids and teachers as well.

**Mrs. McQuade:** I think we have been rewarded for our advanced planning with shovel ready projects. If we have these things in the pipeline, we won't make stupid decisions. The more planning we do the better position we are in.

**Mr. Knight:** I'm looking at the spreadsheet and the number carrying us to 2022. Is this the bond we're going to get for the next six years?

**Mr. Charbonneau:** If we are awarded this bond at the next election, these are security upgrades we're spending money on.

**Mr. Araujo:** 81%. I think that we get a \$25M bond and RIDE approves reimbursement, that's great but it's where RIDE comes in on it. If RIDE approves it, that's a win.

**Mrs. DiCenso:** As long as I'm Superintendent, I say we keep asking until we get \$273M.

**Mr. Knight: This is \$25M of City bonding. I'm looking at what the City Council is going to look at and I think they're going to ask us to scale it back.**

**Mr. Charbonneau: We can do that if they come back with that.**

**Mr. Knight: They cannot do that. That's a City of Pawtucket responsibility bond period!**

**i. School Committee Policies 1st Passage**

**• CBI—Superintendent Evaluation**

**Ms. Dube: The Superintendent Evaluation grew out of subcommittee asking to create a policy saying we will evaluate our Superintendent in accordance with Rhode Island General Law (RIGL). This is a general policy.**

**Mrs. McQuade moved to approve the first passage of School**

**Committee Policy CBI—Superintendent Evaluation. Ms. Bonollo seconded.**

**Ms. Grant: The second to last paragraph, I'm confused. Who are the committee members—School Committee or evaluation team?**

**Ms. Dube: All School Committee Members. All will evaluate and compile in one document. They will remain confidential.**

**Ms. Grant: So you're saying #3 is taken from #2?**

**Ms. Dube: committee will file an annual public report. Most of this comes from Narragansett. This section came from Providence at Ms. Bonollo's request.**

**Mr. Araujo: This one I'm not comfortable with. The purpose of this, having individual evaluations from Members—a lot can go on in a year. Someone could have an ax to grind. I was thinking come up with a tool agreed upon with consortium for this group and come back. This is not what I was really thinking of. Compiling a report for the public? Principals' evaluations are not made public. It's like making personnel file public and that's not a public matter. I get that Narragansett has it. I'm not comfortable with it.**

**Mrs. DiCenso: Let me give you an example of a teacher's evaluation and principal. If we write an evaluation on a teacher or principal, we**

have to have evidence of true data of the work. Sometimes we present our scores and the person says you don't have all the data, I will bring more. It's about a building of trust that the teacher or principal can bring forward evidence I'm this not that. Written evaluations are confidential and if in a personnel file, would that be where they live in my personnel file or in a file in Ms. Liss office that could go to the press?

Ms. Dube: This is about providing parameters and may change year to year. Evaluation instrument will be based upon National Standards. This is how we're going to design the evaluation. It says we don't want to micromanage. We want to make sure it's fair and equitable. We're going to come up with a process that we all agree upon. The paragraph you are focusing on, the documents don't even exist. I think the last paragraph was read as those documents do exist when we meant if they exist. It is our policy that we will evaluate on a yearly basis.

Mrs. DiCenso: This says this does include but more importantly this #2 you're writing a policy for your future. Are people going to be comfortable coming to this district years from now knowing they will be evaluated every year? I think that #2 would be something interpreted as a problem for someone applying for this job. I think making it more general would be wise.

Mr. Knight: I have a lot of problems with this. They have the right to

**advance notice in public or not. The other thing is we have a contract provision that requires us to evaluate the Superintendent and we ask that she be involved. This policy will tie the hands of the Superintendent of the future. I think it's time to send it back to the Superintendent Evaluation Committee.**

**Mr. Knight moved to table the first passage of School Committee Policy CBI-Superintendent Evaluation and send it back to the Superintendent Evaluation Committee. Ms. Bonollo seconded.**

One section struck through violation on strict attendance, not supposed to be struck through.**
