The following was discussed at today's meeting:

We agreed that everyone would take home all new correspondence: updated exam applications and instructions, the sample exam and the 5 completed exams to read over during the next few weeks in order to give them the attention they deserve. There was no time to go over each one during the meeting. Upon next meeting we will finalize all questions and answers and agree on final format of exams.

Someone suggested we add questions relating to the selling of trip insurance. I went to The Insurance Division to ask if travel agents

need a license to sell travel insurance. The answer is yes, each individual selling or soliciting a limited line of insurance requires a Limited Line Insurance Producer License. The travel industry was originally told by Insurance Companies that only one person per agency needed license. This raised some more questions during the meeting. Beth Dwyer, Attorney for the Insurance Division came in to help answer some of the questions. I agreed to send out a notice to all travel agencies to inform them of this policy. Moe Rondeau raised the issue of bring back the travel commission to weed out the old laws and bring attention to state leaders the problems facing the travel industry today. I will see what can be done.

Meeting was adjourned with agreement to meet again on Monday, September 17, 2007 at 9.30 a.m. in the commercial Licensing Conference room, 233 Richmond Street, Providence, RI, to finalize completed exams.
