

Student Emergency Medical Technicians- All Levels

Hospital Clinical Rotation

A person, duly enrolled in a Department-approved Emergency Medical Technician training program, may begin Hospital Clinical rotations and perform functions as an EMT at the level for which he or she is being trained, under the following restrictions:

(A) Any and all patient contact by the student is directly supervised and evaluated by an on-site licensed health care professional trained at or above the level at which the student EMT is being trained

(B) The student shall have successfully completed any and all non-clinical training requirements prior to patient contact for the type(s) of treatment or care being provided.

(C) The student complies with all policies and procedures of the training program Instructor Coordinator, the health care facility responsible for the patient's care, and the Department.

Pre-Hospital Field Clinical Rotation

A person, duly enrolled in a Department-approved Emergency Medical Technician training program, may function in the pre-hospital field setting, as an EMT at the level for which he or she is being trained, under the following restrictions:

(A) Any and all patient contact by the student is directly supervised and evaluated by an on-site licensed Emergency Medical Technician at or above the level at which the student EMT is being trained

(B) The student shall have successfully completed any and all non-clinical training requirements and Hospital clinical rotations, prior to patient contact for the type(s) of treatment or care being provided in the pre-hospital field setting.

(C) The student complies with all policies and procedures of the training program Instructor Coordinator, the licensed ambulance service, licensed Emergency Medical Technicians responsible for the patient's care, and the Department.
