7. Brickyard Bar & Grill

In that on March 17, 2009 at approximately 7:19 p.m. Captain Collins

and Sergeant Jaimie Calise were working the alcohol compliance detail with two undercover/underage buyers. The Officers stopped at the Brickyard Pub, 2276 Warwick Ave. and the two buyers entered the establishment.

Upon entering the establishment, the officers observed the two underage buyers seated at the bar with a Miller Lite beer in front of each. They pointed out the female bartender who had served the beer. The officers seized the bottles and the underage buyers left the place of business. The officers identified themselves to the on-duty manager, David LeBlanc and explained what had occurred. The officers and Mr. LeBlanc and the bartender went into an office to complete paperwork and summonsed the bartender.

The bartender was identified and issued a summons to appear in District Court on April 6th.

She volunteered that “she swore those kids had been in here before.”

The owner of the bar Dennis LeBlanc was contacted by phone and advised of the violation and the fact that the Board of Public Safety would be contacting him. The Officer was informed that David LeBlanc was the owner’s brother not the manager of the establishment. Funds of \$5.50 were utilized for the purchase. The two beers were tagged at HQ and placed into evidence.

Due to the aforementioned facts the management of Brickyard Bar & Grill, 2276 Warwick Ave, Warwick, is in violation of the following rules

and regulations issued by the Board of Public Safety for the orderly operation of liquor establishments. (09-658-AR)

Article # 17 State Law and Regulations: These regulations are in addition to State Law and Regulations to which all licenses are subject.

Title 3, Chapter 8, Section 5, of the Rhode Island General Laws, as amended, which in essence states that it is unlawful to sell an intoxicating beverage to anyone under the age of twenty-one (21).
