LICENSES AND PERMITS

3. Letter from East Greenwich Yacht Club advising the Board of Public Safety that on January 1, 2010 they will technically be closing the right of way which runs from Division Street north across East

Greenwich Yacht Club property to the Norton Shipyard. The right of way will be closed for purposes of the East Greenwich Yacht Club notifying the entire world that it in fact owns the property over which the right of way exists. The Yacht Club will be placing a movable barricade across the right of way at its intersection with Division Street. In the event that an emergency should arise, the barricade can be removed with very little effort. The movable barricade will be removed on January 2, 2010. (informational purposes only)

4. Brady's Liquors

In that on November 21, 2009, at approximately 21:43 hours Officer McGee was on routine patrol in the area of Brady's Liquors, 1230 West Shore Road when he observed suspicious activity involving a vehicle. Approaching the vehicle the officer observed three subjects who appeared to be very young. The subject outside of the vehicle was identified as the registered owner with a DOB of 3/23/90. His passengers DOB's were 7/23/91 and 11/2/91. Officer McGee walked to the subjects and questioned why they were at that location to which the owner of the vehicle had no explanation. The officer noticed a can of beer in an open backpack of the vehicle. Officer McGee asked the subject to open the hatchback at that time and located approximately 11 cans of both Keystone Light and Milwaukee's Best, cool to the touch and also 2 half pints of E and J brandy. Officer Maggiacomo arrived on the scene and a further search of the vehicle

was conducted. Officer Maggiacomo spoke to the clerks inside. One of clerk's later identified as Erica Dearing indicated that she had sold the alcohol to the subject. She said that he had been in the store several times with a driver's license indicating he was 21. She told the officer she didn't check it tonight because he is like a regular customer. It should be noted that no other id was located on his person or in the vehicle. Carol Brady responded to the scene with her son Jay. Statements were obtained from Dearing and the other cashier. It should also be noted that the id book was checked for the subject and no id was located. Based on the information above the Clerk at Brady's Liquors was cited with selling alcohol to minors. (Incident No. 09-5597-OF)

Due to the aforementioned facts the management of Brady's Liquors is in violation of the following rules and regulations issued by the Board of Public Safety for the orderly operation of liquor establishments.

R. I. General Law 3-7-6.1 Mandatory Alcohol Server Training

Article # 16 State Law and Regulations: These regulations are in addition to State Law and Regulations to which all licenses are subject.

Title 3, Chapter 8, Section 5, of the Rhode Island General Laws, as amended, which in essence states that it is unlawful to sell an

intoxicating beverage to anyone under the age of twenty-one (21).

In that on December 19, 2009 at approximately 1901 hours Detective Medeiros working a patrol division overtime shift assigned to Post 6 was dispatched to 105 Walton Ave. for a female reporting a male with a head injury. Upon arrival Detective Medeiros noted that the Warwick Fire Department was on the scene and treating the male victim. The medics assigned to the rescue stated that the victim had a possible broken nose and a laceration to the back of his head and were transporting him to Kent County Hospital. Detective Medeiros noted that the victim appeared to be intoxicated. The two individuals present with him stated that they were all at the Bottom Line Bar on the deck. A male subject approached shook hands and then began to assault the victim. The male assailant then left. The two friends transported the victim to his residence and then called for a rescue. Both friends stated they could not identify the assailant. It should be noted that the victim was interviewed but was uncooperative and made a motion indicating that his lips are sealed. Sergeant Sullivan dispatched patrol units to Bottom Line Bar. According to Sergeant

Sullivan and Detective Medeiros the victim was uncooperative and did not wish to press charges. Officers Marshall and Parmenter responded to the Bottom Line Bar located at 415 Palmer Ave. in reference to the assault. The officers spoke with two employees who had been working at the time of the assault Michael Lavery and Tracey Cosenza. Mr. Lavery stated he did not know what prompted the assault but assisted Mr. Gallagher one of the owners in breaking up the fight with the two males. Warwick Police had received no notification from the establishment than an incident had occurred there. (See incident report 09-6071 OF)

Due to the aforementioned facts the management of Bottom Line Bar & Grille is in violation of the following rules and regulations issued by the Board of Public Safety for the orderly operation of liquor establishments.
