LICENSES AND PERMITS

3. Major Sean T. Collins requests permission to retire from active service with the Warwick Police Department effective February 15, 2011 having served 26 years. Major Collins last working day will be Friday, December 17, 2010. Major Collins will be purchasing three

years of active military time that he completed prior to becoming a police officer. Major Collins will be retiring with a pension rate of 72.452 percent.

4. Fat Belly's Restaurant

On November 24, 2010 at approximately 1930 hours, Officer McGee elected to do a liquor check at Fat Belly's Pub at 252 Old Forge Road. After speaking to the on-duty manager Officer McGee determined that they did not have an active liquor license in the establishment. The liquor license posted on the wall had expired in December 2009. It should also be noted that the manager was also unable to locate the minor book for the establishment. The manager then contacted the owner Scott Parker over the phone who advised him that they had applied for a new liquor license, however, they had not responded to City Hall to pick it up. Due to the aforementioned facts the management of Fat Belly's is in violation of the following rules and regulations issued by the Board of Public Safety for the orderly operation of liquor establishments.

1. License Posted: The license for the premises may be posted, but must be shown to any authorized person on demand. [Amended

Regulation of Sales**

8. (c) Every retail Class A, B, C, and D licensee shall cause to be kept a book or photographic reproduction equipment which provides the same information as required by the book. That licensee and/or the licensee's employee shall require any person who has shown a document as set forth in this section substantiating his or her age to sign that book or to permit the taking of his or her photograph and indicate what document was presented. Use of the photographic reproduction equipment is voluntary for every Class A, B., C and D licensee.

5. Nostalgia Grill & Lounge

On December 19, 2010 at approximately 0205 hours Sergeant Snow while in marked unit S-7 and in the area of Warwick Avenue and Post Road observed numerous cars in the parking lot of Nostalgia's bar, 557 Warwick Ave. Upon entering the parking lot and exiting the

marked unit Sgt. Snow observed several individuals inside the bar hanging around. At this point dispatch was asked if Nostalgia's had requested a time extension and were advised no. It was at this point that Sgt. Snow entered the bar and observed approximately 15 people standing around talking. At this point everyone in the bar was advised to leave immediately. The owner identified as Joseph Shaw advised that he had lost track of time and apologized for the mix up. Mr. Shaw was advised that he had been warned on three previous occasions and report regarding this incident was going to be forwarded to licensing. Mr. Shaw was visibly upset and felt as if he was being singled out. He was advised that closing hours are strictly enforced and if a time extension is necessary he needs to call and speak with the Lieutenant before 0200 hours. Please note that no bottles or glasses of any kind were on the bar and the individuals inside the bar were either members of the band or employees of the bar.

Due to the aforementioned facts the management of Nostalgia Grill & Lounge

is in violation of the following rules and regulations issued by the Board of Public Safety for the orderly operation of liquor establishments.

1. CLEARANCE OF PREMISES AND ASSOCIATED AREAS:

A. All patrons shall leave the licensed premises within one-half hour after the required closing time, and all employees shall leave the licensed premises within one hour after the required closing time, and all employees and patrons shall leave the associated parking and outside areas within one hour after the required closing time.

B. In the event of extenuating circumstances, the licensee may request an extension from the commanding officer on duty of the Warwick Police Department. Such an extension, if granted, shall be for a specified time.

6. Jefferson Grill

On 12/19/10 at 0235 hours Lt. David DeAngelis observed a vehicle running with the headlights on in the parking lot of the Jefferson Pub on Kilvert St. Upon entering the premises the manager announced that the establishment was closed. Lt. DeAngelis asked her if she was aware of the time, at which time she apologized and stated they had had a Christmas Party there on this night and was running late. A time check indicated it was 0236 hours. The manager was advised that it is customary to call the Warwick Police when any liquor

-serving establishment was going to run over the time limit of 0200 hours. She was then advised that a violation was going to be sent to the City's Licensing Unit.

Due to the aforementioned facts the management of Jefferson Grill is in violation of the following rules and regulations issued by the Board of Public Safety for the orderly operation of liquor establishments.

2. CLEARANCE OF PREMISES AND ASSOCIATED AREAS:

C. All patrons shall leave the licensed premises within one-half hour after the required closing time, and all employees shall leave the licensed premises within one hour after the required closing time, and all employees and patrons shall leave the associated parking and outside areas within one hour after the required closing time.

D. In the event of extenuating circumstances, the licensee may request an extension from the commanding officer on duty of the Warwick Police Department. Such an extension, if granted, shall be for a specified time.
