ADDENDUM

127. Gauchos Do Brazil

On 4/29/11 at approximately 0200 hours, Sergeant Lima along with Officer Andrews responded to 24 Jefferson Blvd., Gauchos Do Brazil to conduct a liquor/business check. Sergeant Lima was made aware that Gauchos Do Brazil had recently applied and been granted a license to stay open for business to serve food only from 1 to 5 AM. However, all alcohol related sales/consumption still had to follow current liquor laws. Sgt. Lima was also made aware that no hookah smoking was allowed inside of the establishment. Upon arrival at the scene, Sergeant Lima noticed that the parking lot was $\frac{3}{4}$ full. Sergeant Lima and Officer Andrews responded inside and both immediately observed the area was overwhelmed with smoke. Upon moving into the main dining room area of the restaurant Sergeant Lima observed 5 tables full of patrons with each table having a hookah pipe on it. Sgt. Limas also observed patrons at each table

utilizing the hookah pipes thus creating the smoke inside the establishment. Sgt. Lima estimated the crowd to be approximately 100 people. All patrons were acting in an orderly manner. Sergeant Lima made contact with the owner Carlos Gumbs who told him that he believed he was allowed to have hookah's. (11-1923 OF)

16. STATE LAW AND REGULATIONS These regulations are in addition to State Law and regulations to which all licenses are subject.

14) "Smoking" means inhaling, exhaling, burning or carrying any lighted cigar, cigarette, pipe, weed, plant, or other combustible substance in any manner or in any form;
provided, however, that smoking shall not include burning during a religious ceremony.
