Bulgarmarsh Recreation Fund Raising Sub-committee.

Mrs. Zeramby reported that Tiverton Substance Abuse task Force has t-shirts from a previous fundraiser for the Bulgarmarsh rec area. There was discussion about using the logo from those t-shirts (design by Ariel McCarthy) to make and sell other t-shirts for the Bulgarmarsh area if the t-shirts from the task force are not available for this.

Mr. Steckman reported that the town is attempting to get a government grant to help finance improvements to the Bulgarmarsh Recreation area. The town will match with the same amount. Fundraising would help with this process. An architect will design the Bulgarmarsh Rec. area.

Gary Rose volunteered to chair the Fundraising Committee.

Possibility of a usage fee for fields was discussed but no decision was made.

Bob Martin will look into acquiring signs from the state which will advertise that a park is in the vicinity.
